



FOX LAKE FARM - RULES

All riders must wear USEA, SEI or FEI approved safety helmet or head gear at all times when riding regardless of purpose or style.

No jumping should take place unless there is at least one other person on the ground is aware the rider is jumping and can see and hear the rider. It is the rider's sole responsibility to make the groundsperson aware of his/her intention to jump.

All riders must wear safe clothing, boots with heels and appropriate apparel.

All riders must sign a waiver in advance of riding on the property.

All horses must have a current and valid Coggins test with a copy on file with the Bakers. For the purpose of these rules "current" means less than a year old.

All riders must not have anything in their mouth when riding, including but not limited to chewing gum, snuff, tobacco products or other items.

Pick up any manure and remove from the ring.

Do not ride when there is standing water in the ring.

The Bakers retain the right to ask anyone they perceive to be exhibiting unsafe riding practices to dismount and leave the property on foot.

All tack must be in good repair without damage or excess wear.

Beware of dogs & cats. Do not feed the animals - horses, dogs or cats.

No other pets, dogs, cats or animals on the property without permission.

Horse owners, rider and any guests on the property must display suitable and proper behavior at all times including but not limited to good sportsmanship, no foul language, no abuse of any horse or person, proper respect of any laborers, appropriate hours of coming onto the property and respect of other people and animals.

Aisle ways and barn areas are to remain free from clutter so as to provide a safe working condition for all others.

No riding of a horse inside the stable is allowed.

Under North Carolina law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. Chapter 99E of the North Carolina General Statutes.
